
Social Inclusion of Roma in Serbia through Education Reform

Background:

- In Europe \rightarrow
 - Estimated 90% Roma households below poverty lines
 - Less than **1/3** of Roma have paid employment
 - Only about 15% of Roma children complete high school
 - Discrimination in employment, education, housing, and health care
- In Serbia \rightarrow
 - Officially make up 2% of population (unofficially 6-8%)
 - **78%** relative poverty, **10%** poverty below \$2.15/day
 - Only about 12% finish high school; almost none finish higher education
 - Overrepresentation in special schools
 - High discrimination in education system from teachers, other students, and parents of non-Roma students
 - Roma girls have higher disadvantage in school

Goal 1: Increased access

- Free textbooks, transportation
- Scholarships to stay in school
- Roma Education Fund, USAID

Goal 2: Reintegration

- Access to pre-schools
- Implement Roma TAs for tests
- Education Reform Initiative SEE

Goal 3: Inclusion/Anti-Discrimination

- Training teachers/administrators
- Reform curriculum
- Roma Education Fund
